THE GREAT RETRIEVE

On Wednesday 6th January it was late afternoon after a nice days flying in the Jabiru. I was contemplating another coffee or not when Angela came down from the office to announce that Ian Philp had out-landed near Wasleys. Glider pilots and Brian Walsh, the tuggie, had left so it wasn't an aero-tow. Geoff Wood was still about so we got together as a retrieve crew.

I found Ian's car at 23 and brought it back to the glider trailer park. First decision was to find the right trailer, then how to undo the park brake on the trailer. Geoff and I scratched our heads and Andrew Wright had some advice but Geoff used his strength, the brake released and off we went.

Geoff had the address and the car's GPS accepted it and a lovely voice told us where to go. We passed Wasleys, then Hamley Bridge, took a couple of dirt roads and pulled up at a farm. Ian was happy to see us, got in the car and said, "it is just over there". It certainly was lovely country, rolling paddocks with a bit of stubble, through a creek bed and over some rises. Every time we came to a rise, I expected to see the glider and then we finally did. A lovely sight – a white glider in a golden field of stubble, which had landed perfectly in line with the crop lines.

The trailer was opened and lined up in front of IUN, the tailplane and canopy off. Aircraft level, pin out, port and then starboard wing neatly installed in the trailer. Then canopy back on and fuselage down the centre and tied down. Very nicely done. The trailers are great, they do make the job much easier. Then back home. Thank you Ian and Geoff for the experience.

I did reflect on the old days, flying from Stonefield and doing retrieves near Wanby where we retrieved the sailplane but couldn't find the pilot who had found a way to get home so he could get to work on Monday. Lots of little farms around – but all deserted. Or out-landing at Clare in a Libelle with leaking water ballast and spending the night in air conditioned comfort at the Clare Police Station. Pam rang the club to see where I was but the opinion from the bar was that "he has probably out-landed. He'll be alright – not much we can do tonight". No i-phones in those days.

A NEW GFC

No, this is not a financial prediction.



It's about the club's new-to-us glider, the LS8 VH-GFC, seen here on its recent test flight on Queensland.

It's now arrived at Gawler! The LS8 is a modern single-seat 18 m unflapped glider. It was purchased in the latter part of 2020 to replace the Discus we sold. It has excellent performance and a cockpit which

it is hoped will be more comfortable for those who do not fit easily into a Discus. The standards for conversion to the LS8 have been decided – see an instructor if you're interested.

BUT WAIT, THERE'S MORE...

Also new to the ASC is the first motor glider to be owned by the club for many years. It is a Super Dimona, purchased from the Scout group which had been operating it at Blanchetown. It has been out of the air for some time and requires an overhaul, and Paul Clift has that in hand. Hopefully it will take to the air again in a couple of months and when it does, it will add a whole new range of flying possibilities for club members to enjoy.
